Questions from the floor:

Is there a program for players who have graduated from U18?

➤ Todd Allan shared information regarding Juvenile hockey (U21), which offers a continuation of Association hockey for players aged 18-21

How does the Association determine how many players there are trying out for rep? How is the rep tryout fee determined?

Chad Dey explained that registration numbers determine number of teams for the following season. The availability of ice also plays a role in how many rep teams we can have. Tryout fees have been consistent for many years. The fee is refundable if a player chooses not to try out. Fees are comparable to other Associations.

Where do we stand on mini nets?

➤ The Association has looked into purchasing them. They are expensive (\$2000 each). Boots has had preliminary conversations with Delta Lacrosse around sharing their nets and boards. More info to come.

Can we get a sheet of synthetic ice at Tilbury, so coaches do not have to walk on cement?

Chad Dey agreed this is something we will look into. It may fall under City of Delta responsibility.

Are we putting any pressure on PCAHA to have N. Delta girls be mandated to stay in South Delta?

- North Delta girls are given the option of playing in Surrey, Richmond and South Delta
- North Delta is reluctant to tell their girls to play for South Delta as they want to retain their membership
- Cate is aware of the need to continue building the Stars program and is actively working on ways to do this. The program is growing and we are gaining momentum.

Does the Board have a strategic plan in place?

- From a risk perspective, we are aware that we lose some players to other leagues; retention can be an issue, but our perspective has been that we are proud of our players being able to play higher levels of hockey and players are always welcome to return to SDMHA.
- Our numbers are still growing and we have some exciting changes coming, with regards to player and coach development



- We have put extensive thought into the coaching staff we hire for rep teams, so that players are receiving high level instruction and development
- ➤ Ice availability has become an issue for the Association as our numbers increase; we have looked elsewhere at ice slots, but there is a high cost involved that we would rather not pass on to our families.
- ➤ Each season brings its own strengths and challenges, so our Executive focuses monthly meetings on what is working and where we can improve to make sure that our families have the best on and off ice experience.
- Our goal continues to be to offer a well-rounded hockey program that provides development and enjoyment for all our players.

Sanctioned vs Unsanctioned Hockey Rules?

- > BC Hockey needs to bring clarity to this; we need to abide by their policy
- ➤ We have loosened our policy around this and players are welcomed back if they choose to come back from other leagues.

Does the City of Delta have any plans with regards to ice availability?

- the membership is encouraged to write letters to the City to inquire about increased ice availability
- we share ice with ringette, figure skating, skating clubs and City of Delta programming
- we are a growing Association and ice availability will continue to be a challenge
- morningice slots are available and will be utilized more in the 2023/2024 season
- it has been explored to partner up with TFN to build a rink; the conversation has started
